Harvest Christian Academy is a K-12 school located near Fort Worth, TX. HCA is a comprehensive four-year high school enrolling 100 students in grades 9-12. The school opened in the fall of 1995 and graduated its first class in 1997. HCA is accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International.

### Curriculum

Curriculum goals and objectives are established for every subject. These standards either meet or exceed the Texas Education Association requirements. The academic program is organized on a rotating block schedule. Seven credits per year is the maximum course load; students take four rotating 115-minute block classes, and one 40-minute class that does not rotate. Block classes are yearlong. Honors classes are offered in English, science, history, math, and Spanish. Entry into honors classes requires a student to maintain a 90% average in their class. Entry into the math honors class requires a grade average of 90% and an 80% proficiency score on the Hanna-Orleans Algebra Readiness exam at the end of a student's seventh grade year. Twenty-one hours of dual credit classes are offered during the student's senior year. Students may take AP classes through a partnership with an online school.

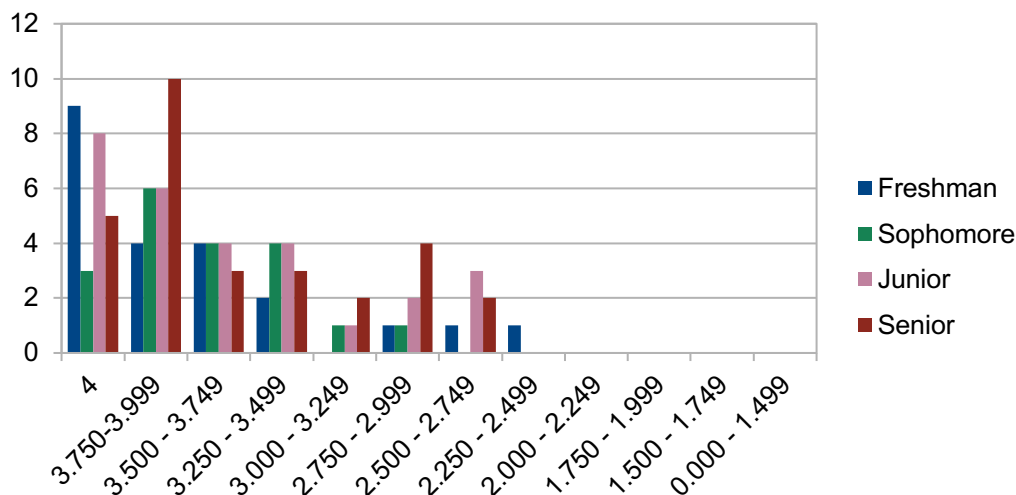

School Policy eliminated class rank with the exception of valedictorian and salutatorian. GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, or with honors algebra in eighth grade, all subjects whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Honors classes, dual credit classes and AP classes are awarded additional points to the class average. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and May.
